



ADMISSION CRITERIA FOR THE AuD AND MA-SLP

Undergraduate Degree

- A Bachelor's degree in Speech and Hearing Science, Communication Sciences and Disorders, or Speech-Language Pathology and Audiology fulfills the undergraduate degree requirement for admission to our graduate programs in Audiology or Speech-Language Pathology. A Bachelor's degree in a related major with a minor in Speech and Hearing Science may also fulfill the requirements.
- Students with non-Speech and Hearing Science Bachelor's degrees (e.g., linguistics, psychology, biology, special education, etc.) are also encouraged to apply. There are specific undergraduate courses that are prerequisite to beginning a graduate program in either Audiology or Speech-Language Pathology. Students are able to take many of these courses online during the summer prior to beginning the graduate program through the Department's Summer Institute.

Undergraduate Cumulative GPA

The Ohio State University Graduate School requires a minimum cumulative undergraduate GPA of 3.0 (4.0 scale) for admission to all graduate programs. The average cumulative GPA for recent admits to our graduate programs in Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology currently ranges between 3.7-3.8.

GRE Scores

The Ohio State University Graduate School requires that all applicants submit scores from the Graduate Record Examination (GRE). There is no minimum score required for admission to either the Audiology or Speech-Language Pathology program. However, to be competitive for admission, scores for the Verbal, Quantitative and Analytical sections at or above the 50th percentile are recommended.
