Our Mission


We are a program for persons living with aphasia that provides structured group sessions to facilitate communication skills. We also provide training for students in the Department of Speech and Hearing Science at OSU.

We are a group of people working together to overcome communication difficulties due to aphasia.






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Hostiles Movie Review



On Friday we ate breakfast and we celebrated each other with a slideshow, said our goodbyes, and then got on a plane for a long flight home. An adventure to remember!
























How to play Frisbee Football


1.CAIRO: I went to Cairo in 2008. I was getting my master's degree in marketing.

Thurmunator, and if you eat it all in one sitting you get it for free. It is called the Thurmunator Challenge. On the Thurmunator is two hamburger patties, lettuce, tomato, onions, bacon, cheese, and whatever else you want on it. You have to eat it with a fork and knife because it is too big to hold! Thurman's also has good buffalo wings, which you also have to eat with a fork and knife because they are too big to hold and they are quite sloppy. When I went with my father, I had the western bacon cheeseburger. It had barbeque sauce, lettuce, cheese, onion straws, and bacon. It was great! They also have hand dipped ice cream milkshakes that are huge and look good. I recommend the cookies and cream milkshake. Thurman's Café is a very busy place, so I would recommend going for an early dinner to avoid the crowds. There is also a location called Son of Thurman, which has the same menu but is a bit smaller in Delaware, Ohio. I went to this location. It is not well known so it is less busy and easier to go to. There is also a Thurman's To Go, in Pataskala, Ohio. This location has a similar menu but it is carry out only. If I had to give Thurman's a rating, I would rate it 10/10 for their food. It is a fantastic place to go if you like beef! I would rate their atmosphere a 5/10, it was a bar atmosphere and it was kind of smoky and loud inside. 




The Red Door Tavern
