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# Degree Requirements for the Doctor of Audiology degree (Au.D.)

The Department offers a post-baccalaureate Doctor of Audiology (Au.D.) program for students interested in clinical practice in audiology. The Au.D. program is a 4-year program and is designed to extend over 11 semesters of consecutive full-time enrollment. The final year of the program is devoted primarily to an extended clinical externship. The Au.D. program prepares students for certification from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association and for licensure in the state of Ohio.

#### Overview:

**Year One**: The first two semesters are focused entirely on coursework and preparation for clinical practice. A qualifying examination based on the first two semester's studies is given in Finals week of spring semester. If a student fails to pass the qualifying examination, she/he may retake the examination during summer session. The retake typically occurs 6 weeks after the initial exam is taken. If a student fails to pass the qualifying examination on the retake, the department asks the Graduate School to dismiss the student from the program. While coursework continues in Summer Session, students who pass the initial exam also commence clinical practicum.

**Year Two**: The balance between coursework and practicum continues this year. By Spring Semester students are expected to have selected and commenced their Capstone Projects.

- Capstone Project: Each student is required to complete a Capstone Project during the course of the Au.D. program. During the 2nd year of the program, each student must declare which of two Capstone options she/he will complete: 1) Research Project, or 2) Specialization (see descriptions below). Each option requires a minimum of 10 credit hours to be completed between spring semester of the 2<sup>nd</sup> year and spring semester of the 3<sup>rd</sup> year. There is a final oral examination based on the Capstone Project. The final oral examination is scheduled as soon as the capstone project is complete and approved by the student's advisor, but must occur no later than March of the 4<sup>th</sup> year.
  - Research Project: Students, in consultation with their advisors, will design and conduct a research project that will culminate in a research manuscript (i.e., Capstone document) comparable to a Master's thesis. Students who choose this option should begin their project no later than summer of their 2nd year and must enroll in a minimum of 10 semester credits of Capstone hours (SHS 8997) over the course of their 2nd & 3rd years.
  - Specialization: The student, in consultation with their advisor, will complete coursework outside the department (minimum 6 semester credit hours) in a specific topic area. The specialization must culminate in a scholarly and original paper (i.e., Capstone document) on the specialization topic and its importance to the profession of audiology. Students who choose this option should begin taking courses spring semester of their 2nd year, and must complete 6 credit hours outside the department and 4 credits of Capstone hours (SHS 8997) by the end of spring semester of their 3rd year.

**Year Three**: The balance between coursework and practicum continues in the first two semesters of this year. Summer Session marks the beginning of the 3-semester externship (4<sup>th</sup>-Year Clinical Externship).

**Year Four**: This final year is comprised of autumn, spring, and, potentially, summer semesters. Students are placed in an extended clinical experience (4<sup>th</sup>-Year Clinical Externship) during this time. Student should expect to leave the Columbus metropolitan area for their 4<sup>th</sup>-year clinical externship, because there are few opportunities with the metropolitan area. Recall that the final oral examination for the Capstone project must occur no later than March of the 4<sup>th</sup> year. Hooding and graduation occur at the end of spring semester.

#### **Final Oral Examination:**

To be completed no later than March of the 4<sup>th</sup> year in order to be eligible for graduation spring semester.

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<sup>\*\*</sup>Completion of the Au.D. program and graduation depends upon the start and completion dates of the 4<sup>th</sup>-year externship. The 4<sup>th</sup>-year externship is the equivalent of one year (minimum 11 months). For example, a student who begins in May and finishes in April is eligible for spring commencement. On the other hand, a student who begins in July and finishes in June is eligible for summer commencement.
